本研究会は、コロナ禍を経験した日本の文脈における文化政策 研究とケアの理論の接続を試みるものである。パンデミックは世界中で ジェンダーや年齢、人種、障害の有無などによる社会の不平等を あらわにした。そんな中、新自由主義による行き過ぎた民営化や自己 責任化を批判し、弱さを抱えながら関係性の中で依存しながら生きて いく方向性を模索する視点としてのケアの倫理に注目が集まっている。 本研究会は、各分野の専門家との議論を通じ、ケアの視点から文化 政策の理論と実践の双方を語る言葉を再発見し、新たに紡ぎ

だす場を継続的に作り出すことを目指すものである。

第一回目の公開研究会では批判的ケア理論の議論を牽引する ジョアン・C・トロント氏に、ケア実践の責任を平等に分配し、みな が「共にケアする」社会のビジョンについて講演を行っていただく。 そして、日本とドイツをフィールドに文化政策を研究し、現在はインター・ ローカルな文化的コモンズの創出に取り組む藤野一夫氏を討論者と して招き、ケアの理論と文化政策研究の接点を模索する。

ミネソタ大学およびニューヨーク市立大学で政治学・名誉教授。オベリン大学を 卒業後、プリンストン大学で博士号を取得。著書に『Moral Boundaries: A Political Argument for an Ethic of Care』(1993年)、『Caring Democracy: Markets, Equality and Justice』(2013年)、『Who Cares? How to Reshape a Democratic Politics』(2015年=岡野八代訳(2020年)『ケアするのは誰か? 新しい民主主義のかたちへ』)のほか、ケアの倫理に関する50以上の論文がある。 彼女の著書・論文は、フランス語、スペイン語、イタリア語、ポルトガル語、ギリシャ語、 日本語、韓国語など、多くの言語に翻訳されている。2015年には、オランダの人文科 学大学から名誉博士号を授与され、ブラウン民主主義賞を受賞。2007年にはフル ブライト・フェローとしてイタリアのボローニャに滞在。現在はニューヨーク在住。

This symposium attempts to connect cultural policy research and theories of care in the context of Japan's experience with the Corona disaster.

The pandemic has revealed social inequalities in terms of gender, age, race, and disability all over the world.

In this scenario, the ethics of care are attracting attention as an alternative to correct the distortions of contemporary Japanese society. This is because the ethics of care criticize excessive privatization and self-responsibility caused by neoliberalism, and allow people to live with their weaknesses and dependency in relationships.

Through discussions with experts in various fields, Arts/Care/Cultural Policy Research Group aims to continuously create a space to rediscover and weave a new language that speaks to both the theoretical and practical aspects of cultural policy from the perspective of care.

In the first symposium, Joan C. Toronto, who has led the current care theory and set forth the vision of 'democracy that cares together', will give a lecture introducing the approach of critical care theory. We will also invite Kazuo Fujino—who has studied cultural policy in Japan and Germany and is currently working on the creation of an inter-local cultural commons—as a discussant to explore the interface between care theory and cultural policy research.

We will explore the relationship between the theories of care and cultural policy research with the audience.

Joan C. Tronto Professor Emerita of Political Science, the University of Minnesota and the City University of New York

Joan C Tronto is professor emerita of political science at the University of Minnesota and the City University of New York. A graduate of Oberlin College, she received her PhD from Princeton University. She is the author of Moral Boundaries: A Political Argument for an Ethic of Care (1993) and Caring Democracy: Markets, Equality and Justice (2013), and Who Cares? How to Reshape a Democratic Politics (2015) and over fifty articles about care ethics. Her work has been translated into many languages, including French, Spanish, Italian, Portuguese, Greek, Japanese, and Korean. In 2015, she was awarded an honorary doctorate by the University for Humanistic Studies in the Netherlands and won the Brown Prize for Democracy. She served as a Fulbright Fellow in Bologna, Italy in 2007. She currently lives in New York City.

Among his recent publications are "Publicity of Public Cultural Institution—Administration, Cooperation, and Philosophy" (2011) , "Creation of the Community and Reform of Public Interest Incorporated Association" in The Administrative Reform and the New Initiative of the Cultural Creation (2013), "Föderalistische Prägung der Deutschen Kulturpolitik" (2017), "Cultural Policy in Municipalities" (2019), "Soziokultur in Deutschland" (2021) and "Cultural Policy for all" (2022).
